# The Start



- **Lack of Open source urgency inside the valley**
- **Most of the students are unaware about the use of Open Source Technologies and Linux**
- **Very less people actually using Linux & Ubuntu**

- **Cannot directly dive into GNOME and related technologies**
- **Had to start right from the scratch**
- **Had to convince colleges for the sessions**
- **Had to make the sessions interactive and fun**



# The Initiative



- **Decided for a Top Down Approach**
- **Start with introducing students right from the ‘ What/ Why is Open Source?’**
- **We needed a distro which is popular and beginner friendly**
- **Solution - “UBUNTU”**

## **Why Ubuntu :**

- **Most of the beginners they start with Ubuntu in Nepal**
- **Ubuntu is synonymous to Linux**

- **Uses GNOME as its Default Desktop Environment**

- **Provided sessions to : 185 students**

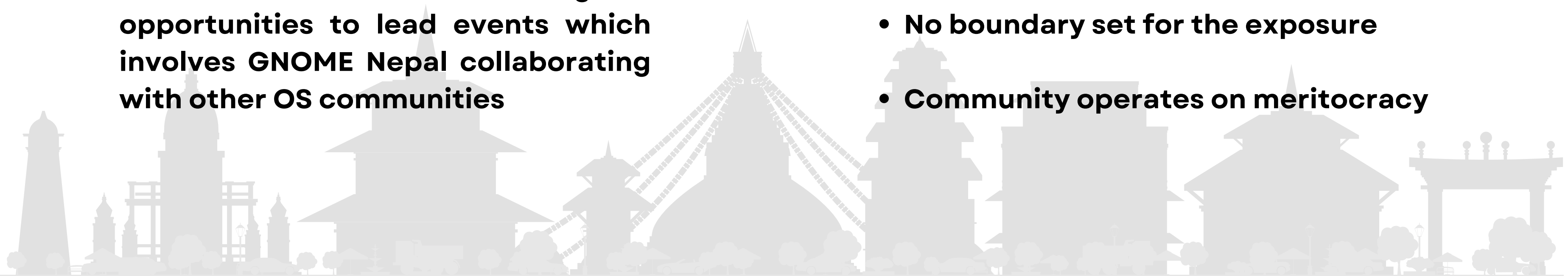


# The Newcomers

- Community operates on meritocracy





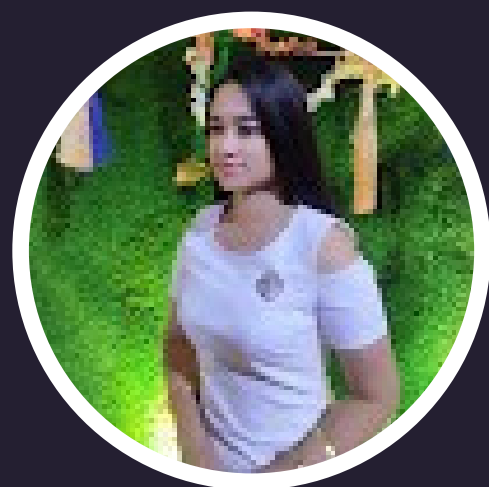
